A note from the Vicar...

Stewardship Programme: Late last year Vestry agreed to undertake a Stewardship Programme which has to do with the way we manage or steward the different kinds of resources God has given us. We have not had one since 2015 and it is an important aspect of our personal discipleship and our support of the mission of our parish. There will be a brochure in the March Mooring Post, testimonies during worship and Bible studies produced following Easter. I invite everyone to prayerfully review your financial giving to the parish and to ask for God’s guidance in this matter.

Admin and Hall Project: At our last Vestry meeting it was agreed to invite Engineering Consultancy firms Ruamoko and Lewis and Barrow to undertake preliminary work on plans for the strengthening of the Hall (Ruamoko) and Admin buildings (Lewis ad

Barrow). This will give us an idea of the likely costs of this work and the split between earthquake repairs and betterment. Many thanks to Corinne Haines who is leading our parish project team.

Confirmation: On Sunday 7 April ‘newly minted’ bishop Peter Carrell will be with us for a Confirmation Service. Confirmation is a way of expressing commitment – by a person baptised as an infant or by a person returning to faith after a time of absence or by a person wanting to strengthen their faith through careful preparation and public declaration. If you or a younger person you know would like to be confirmed please contact Rev Jenny or myself. Preparation sessions begin on Sunday 17 Feb. We also hope to baptise some adults so if you have not yet been baptised please contact us also.



Message from Vicar General

On the cusp of Waitangi Day, we are called not only to remember and honour our nation's founding document between Crown and Tangata Whenua, but to also be aware of the Colonial and Church history surrounding it and the ongoing implications for justice, peace and equality in our land.

Last Sunday, in our Church calendar, we celebrated the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple (Candlemas)—a convergence of tradition and epiphany as Jesus was recognised and proclaimed by faithful elders as Saviour: 'a light to all nations'. The Feast of Candlemas has been described as being like a 'bitter-sweet hinge'—both looking back to the joy and revelation of Christ's birth and anticipating Lent and the events of Christ's passion and death.

This coming weekend, [our Diocese]...will have its own convergence of tradition and epiphany through the episcopal ordination of Peter Carrell followed by his installation in Cathedral Square, as ninth Bishop of Christchurch. (The latter being a wonderful opportunity for us all to shine Christ's light in the centre of the city.) As we uphold Peter—and Teresa & family—in our prayers, now and into the future, we also need to remember that each and every one of us has been called by God through our baptism, to serve and live out God's mission, supporting our bishop, encouraging our brothers and sisters in Christ, whilst proclaiming and furthering God's kingdom.

It has been a privilege to serve as a member of the Senior Leadership Team with the wise guidance of Archbishop Philip during our episcopal interregnum. We can all look forward to the continued presence, promise and surprise of God in our diocesan future.


We are looking for main meals for 1, 2 or 4 persons especially casseroles, lasagne, shepherd's pie, mild meat curries and rice and quiches.
