**Welcome Prof. Paul!** It is my pleasure to welcome Prof Paul Trebilco to our parish this weekend to help us celebrate St Barnabas Day. I first met Paul when our family walked the Abel Tasman track about 20 years ago and I have admired his writing and ministry at Otago University ever since. Our sons also become friends when they went through Otago together.

Paul studied chemistry at UC, and then did a Bachelor of Divinity at Otago before completing his PhD in the New Testament in 1987 at the University of Durham. He has published work on the Jewish and Greco-Roman backgrounds to the New Testament, the Acts of the Apostles, the apostle Paul, early Christians in Ephesus, the relationship of Scripture and Church tradition, and the self-designations used by the earliest Christians in the New Testament. In 2017,

he was elected as a Fellow of the Royal Society of New Zealand.

We're very privileged to have Paul with us this weekend. Please give him a warm 'St Barnabas' welcome, engage in conversation with him and make the most of his visit!



Dear Mark and the St. Barnabas crew,

Hope life is good for you guys in St. Barnabas at the moment...It must be really satisfying for you guys to be back worshipping in the main building again. We were also hearing a lot about the Anglicost event you guys hosted. It really sounded great we would have loved to have been there.

Tessa and I wanted to express our huge thanks for giving money to help us live here. For the record, we only know that you've given, but we have no idea how much - which we think is great.

We're so grateful for the opportunity to be here, and the last year has been particularly satisfying, with Tessa working on the successful campaign against sachet alcohol and starting the school feeding program. On my end the new health centre initiative is growing fast, as are deliveries and antenatal visits...

As you may have heard, Tessa and I are heading to Cambridge University in September and I'm doing a Masters in Public health. We'll both be supported by Tessa's scholarship from October 2018 until June 2019, so if you are giving us money at the moment, please stop giving in October. If you want to continue supporting great work, a great option would be to support another CMS Mission partner, or give to the CMS general fund for that 9 month period.


## St Barnabas the Encourager

"Joseph, a Levite, born in Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (son of encouragement), sold a field he owned, brought the money, and turned it over to the apostles." (Acts 4:36f). This is the first mention we have of Barnabas.

His new name fits what we know of his actions. When Saul (or Paul) came to Jerusalem after his conversion, most of the Christians there wanted nothing to do with him. They had known him as a persecutor and an enemy of the Church. But Barnabas was willing to give him a second chance. He looked him up, spoke with him, and brought him to see the other Christians, vouching for him.

Later, Paul and Barnabas went on a missionary journey together, taking Mark with them. Part way, Mark turned back and went home. When Paul and Barnabas were about to set out on another such journey, Barnabas proposed to take Mark along, and Paul was against it, saying that Mark had shown himself undependable.

Barnabas wanted to give Mark a second chance, and so he and Mark went off on one journey, while Paul took Silas and went on another. Apparently Mark responded well to the trust given him by the "son of encouragement," since we find that Paul later speaks of him as a valuable assistant (2 Tim 4:11; see also Col 4:10 and Phil 24).
