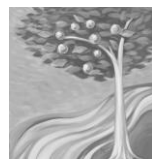

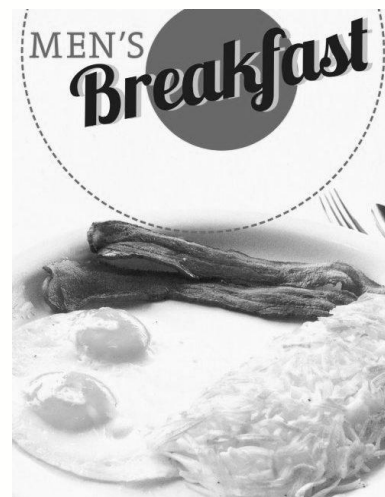

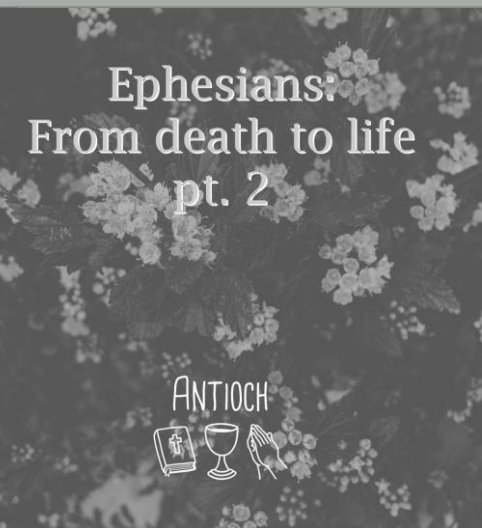

As this is an ongoing ministry please continue to bring meals into the freezer so that we can provide this ministry of care for those in need.

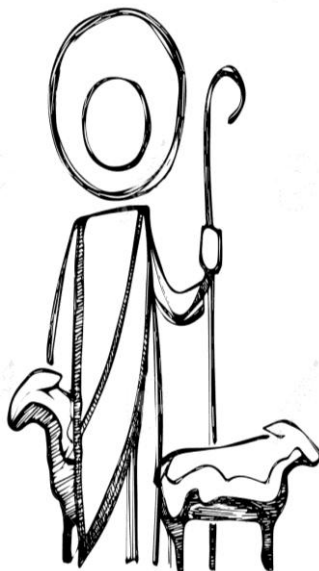
