Cathedral Rebuild Update

An application to the Lottery Significant Project Fund was made by Church Property Trustees (CPT) ... to assist the ChristChurch Cathedral Reinstatement Trust (CCRT), which was established to fundraise the shortfall of funds for the Cathedral reinstatement project.

CPT are pleased to advise that the Lottery Significant Projects Fund has allocated six million dollars towards the reinstatement of ChristChurch Cathedral...

"The Trustees are extremely grateful for the Lottery Significant Project Fund's generosity and are looking forward to locking in other funding so that we can progress the reinstatement of ChristChurch Cathedral," says CPT General Manager, Gavin Holley. "It surely comes at the right time, with the details of the reimagined Square being released, and impetus building for new things to happen moving forward."

In September 2017 the Diocesan Synod voted to instruct CPT to accept, under certain conditions, the terms of the Government offer to reinstate the damaged Cathedral in the Square. Since then work has focused on a number of matters, including CCRT and CPT reaching consensus on terms of a detailed joint venture agreement based on the commercial terms CPT had agreed with the government. Once the terms are in place, CPT and CCRT can focus on the establishment of the Joint Venture Company (JVC) to see through the physical reinstatement.

Moka Ritchie, Deputy Chair of CPT, is delighted that this funding has been approved. "I would like to thank the Lotteries for this generous grant and also thank the staff of CPT for their excellent work in putting this application together. We are pleased that this grant will significantly assist CPT and CCRT in achieving the funding required for the Cathedral..."

Finance Update

To the end of May parish income was \$221,304 - \$15,001 ahead of budget. Expenses were \$233,834 which was \$10,224 below budget. This leaves a year to date net deficit of \$12,530. Ordinary income was significantly lower in May.
