Cathedral Kittens: Kittens born inside the earthquake damaged Christ Church Cathedral were raised in an extended family of cats. Dr Jane Newman is a geologist who lives in Somerfield, and since the beginning of 2013, Jane has invested tens of thousands of dollars of her own money into cages, camera equipment, food, testing, neutering and spaying, to help the cats in the red zone. Jane's project has been facilitated by the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Authority, SPCA Canterbury and the Cats Protection League. McMaster & Heap have provided considerable support as the main supplier of veterinary services. Some wonderful members of the public have helped with donations, and by fostering and finding 'forever homes' for cats and kittens, reporting cat sightings, and stocking feeding stations.
