A note from the Vicar...

Pasifica Weekend: It is with pleasure that I'm able to announce that on the weekend of the 4 and 5 of May next year, the St Andrews High School Brass Band will be visiting our parish. St Andrews is the only Anglican High School in Tonga. This is a fundraising trip for the band so that new brass instruments can be purchased. There will be a combined service on the Sunday morning with our Tongan congregation featuring the band and many other Pasifica features. I will be planning this weekend with Rev Leni Havea and others – I hope we can all get behind this project financially and in other ways. It is a worthy cause and strengthens our relationship with the Anglican Church in Tonga.

Adiaphora: One of the principles established by the English Reformers of the 16th century was that not every church

practice necessarily had to be mandated by scripture. This was the principle of 'adiaphora' which is roughly translated – 'things indifferent' – that is neither prohibited nor mandated by scripture. As a result of this principle Anglicanism retained candles, robes, organs, certain rituals and the adornment of churches and established the 'middle way' between the more radical Christian groups and the Roman Catholic Church. 'Adiaphora' honours the authority of scripture but saves us from restrictive literalism.

Associate Priest: The interview team interviewed a candidate for this position last Sunday afternoon and it went very well. The process of appointment is now being followed through and all going well, an announcement will be made next Sunday 28 October. Arohanui, Mark

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Two recent civic occasions in Christchurch were bathed in Christian prayer – the opening of the new Christchurch Central Library and the opening and blessing of the new Christchurch Hospital Outpatients building. The blessing of the latter...was a strongly bicultural and ecumenical occasion with hospital chaplains and departmental staff all fully involved.

This weekend, approximately eighty women – clergy and lay - from across our Province will be meeting in Fiji for the Anglican Women's Studies Centre Hui : *Pasifika Perspectives – Valuing Tradition, Religion and Arts*. Rev'd. Stephanie Clay and I will be attending...
