Confirmation: I had previously advertised that the Confirmation Service this year was to take place on Sunday 3 March but this was an error – apologies for this. The service will be on Sunday 7 April at a combined Lifestreams and 9.30am service in the church at 10am. It will be a marvellous parish occasion. Some candidates will be baptised and others will be confirmed and of course our new Bishop Peter will led the service. It will be a time of tremendous celebration! If you were baptised as an infant and would like to declare your faith publicly through confirmation, or would like to mark your return to the church and active Christian faith, please see Jenny or me.

Refugee Initiative: Olive Lawson has now attended a training with Red Cross who are managing the resettlement of the refugee families who are coming to Christchurch in March. Refugees are from Afghanistan and

Eritrea. However the support for these families is not being structured in the way we had originally thought. Instead of the parish 'adopting' a particular family, we are being asked to supply volunteers who will be individually assigned to a team who will support a family. If anyone would like to contribute in this way, please speak with Olive.

With new assessments of the “state of play,” we are able to offer parishioners many more tickets for the Ordination Service than originally estimated. We want every person who wants to be at the service to be able to be there. If you do not have a ticket or want a ticket for a friend, please contact your parish office or vicar who can then work with their archdeacon on obtaining the required tickets. (Note that tickets are not required for the Installation Service 3pm in the Square.)

I am looking forward to the Ordination service which will feature music expressing traditional and modern songs, hymns and anthems. Bishop Richard Wallace will be our preacher. Bishops from all Three Tikanga will be present, along with Bishop Paul Martin of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Christchurch.
