## A note from the Vicar...

**Generous Giving:** During the week I received a summary of our outreach giving for last year. A total of \$11,630 was given to projects as diverse as the City Mission (\$2,000), Hospital Chaplaincy (\$750), Petersgate Counselling Centre (\$4,500), Prisoners’ Glasses (\$900) and relief after Cyclone Gita in Tonga (\$3,000). As well as these official donations, individual parishioners gave a further \$3,250 to the Tonga appeal. We are always on the lookout for initiatives we can support both locally and overseas so if you have any ideas, please let me know.

**Community Fun Day:** Our annual Community Fun Day is coming up on Sunday 3 March from 12noon – 3pm. This has been a hugely successful initiative in the past and has enabled us to reach out to our community and to offer a low to no-cost

fun afternoon for all the family. This year we have a number of new items on the programme including pony rides for children and an Anglican Youth choir. So circle the date in your diary and support our Fun Day!

**Ordination of Peter Carrell:** We rejoice with the Carrell family at Peter’s ordination and installation as the 9<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Christchurch next weekend. With new assessments of the “state of play,” we are able to offer parishioners many more tickets for the Ordination Service than originally estimated. We want every person who wants to be at the service to be able to be there. 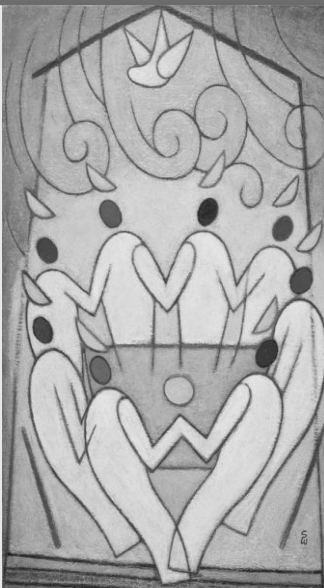
We are looking for main meals for 1, 2 or 4 persons especially casseroles, lasagne, shepherd's pie, mild meat curries and rice and quiches.
